

Lesson of The Day

Indirect Object: hvchim – to or for you (all)

Miko yvt nanta hvchim anoli tuk?

What did the chief tell you all?

Ilefoka hvchim achefa chi ho?

Will she wash clothes for you all?

Word Meaning: **miko** (mehn-koh) = chief

hvchim (ha-chehm) = to or for you (all)

achi (ah-chehn) = future tense marker (the preceding word will drop the final vowel 'a' (achefa) to the vowel 'a' for the future tense ending.

ho (hohn) = question marker **achefa** (ah-che-fah) = wash

tuk (tohk) = past tense marker

nanta (nahn-tah) = what **yvt** (yaht) = subject marker

anoli (ah-noh-lih) = tell/telling

ilefoka (e-lih-foh-kah) = clothes

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
