Body parts ‘nushkobo’ & ‘sv’

‘Sv’ is a possessive personal pronoun that is used when one is referring to emotions, some family relationships and body parts. It can be translated as **‘my’** and also **‘I am’** when describing emotions or state of mind.

Sv nushkobo yvt hotopa.

My head hurts

Chi nushkoba yvt hotopa ho?

Does your head hurt?

Word Meaning:

sv (sah) = my **yvt** (yaht) = subject marker

chi (che) = your **nushkobo** (nosh-ko-bo) = head

hotopa (ho-to-pa) = hurt/s **ho?** (h^onh) = question marker
