

# Lesson of The Day

**chi** = my -nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with a consonant.

**chim** = my -m form, prefixed before words that begin with a vowel.

**Chi tek vt banaha vpa bvnna.**

Your sister wants to eat banaha.

**Chi tek vt nanta haklo?**

What does your sister hear/ or is listening to?

## Word Meaning:

**chi tek** (ch<sup>e</sup>n tek) = your sister

**vt** (aht) = subject marker      **nanta** (nahn-ta) = what

**banaha** (ba-na-ha) = shuck bread

**bvnna** (bahn-na) = wants

**haklo** (hak-lo) = to hear/ to listen

**vpa** (ah-pa) = to eat (with named item preceding it)

Base words for kinship terms:

**hvshki** = mother      **nakfi** = brother      **pokni** = grandmother

**iki** = father      **i tek** = sister      **mafo** = grandfather
