

# Lesson of The Day

Possessive Pronoun: **chi** and **chim** - your

**chi** = nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with a *consonant*

**chim** = m form, prefixed before words that begin with a *vowel*

**Chim aheka atobbi li tuk.**

I paid your bill.

**Chim Ohoyo yvt pisa achukma.**

Your wife is pretty.

Word Meaning: **chim** (chehm) = your

**aheka** (a-he-ka) = bill **ohoyo** (oh-ho-yoh) = woman

**atobbi** (a-tob-bi) = to pay **li** (le) = I, (comes after a verb)

**yvt** (yaht) = subject marker **tuk** (tuk) = past tense marker

**pisa achukma** (pe-sa ah-chohk-mah) = pretty, handsome

**chim ohoyo** (chehmm oh-ho-yoh) = your wife

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
